On behalf of the Jefferson Chamber which represents business interests in the largest parish in the New Orleans Region, I write to you today to offer support for your efforts on behalf of Louisiana as we seek parity in revenue sharing from our national resources. We are in support of the Reinvesting in Shoreline Economies and Ecosystems (RISEE) Act, which seeks to reform the Gulf of Mexico Energy Securitization Act (GOMESA) and create a revenue sharing program from future offshore wind development in federal waters. As a longtime supporter of GOMESA, we celebrate your efforts to achieve a more equitable resource sharing between the states and federal conservation programs, while simultaneously fighting to capture the revenues generated from offshore wind leases and production.
