A BILL

To ensure that Social Security beneficiaries receive regular statements from the Social Security Administration, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “_____ Act”.

5 **SEC. 2. ENSURING BENEFICIARIES RECEIVE REGULAR SO-**
6 **CIAL SECURITY STATEMENTS.**

7 Not later than January 1, 2025, the Commissioner
8 of Social Security shall ensure that—

1 (1) individuals with social security account
2 numbers are mailed a paper social security state-
3 ment whenever they enter the workforce or start a
4 new job;

5 (2) a paper social security statement is mailed
6 to each individual with a social security account
7 number not less frequently than—

8 (A) once every 5 years beginning with the
9 year in which the individual achieves age 25;

10 (B) once every 2 years beginning with the
11 year in which the individual achieves age 55;
12 and

13 (C) annually beginning with the year in
14 which the individual achieves age 60; and

15 (3) individuals with social security account
16 numbers are mailed paper social security statements
17 regardless of whether they have created an online
18 “my Social Security” account with the Social Secu-
19 rity Administration;

20 (4) individuals are able to opt out from receiv-
21 ing paper social security statements (including state-
22 ments otherwise required under this subsection).

1 **SEC. 3. [APPROPRIATION] FOR LIMITATION ON ADMINIS-**
2 **TRATIVE EXPENSES.**

3 There are **[authorized to be appropriated]** to the
4 Commissioner of Social Security for the Social Security
5 Administration's Limitation on Administrative Expenses
6 for each fiscal year beginning with 2024 such sums as are
7 necessary to carry out this Act.
